



Minutes of Annual Parish Meeting – Tuesday 14th May 2019

- 1. Present:** Cllr Dawson (Chair), Cllr Macdonald (Vice Chair), Cllr Wylie, Cllr Duthie, Cllr Kuziara and Cherie Carruthers (Clerk to the Parish Council)
Nine Members of the Public were in attendance.
- 2. Apologies received:** Martin and Penny Wainwright, Anne Clark, Cllr Timothy Hallchurch (CDC), Tony and Pam Matthews.
- 3. Chair's Report:** Cllr Dawson reported on the business of the Parish Council during the past year and summarised her attached report (appendix 1).
- 4. Finance Report:** The Clerk, as Responsible Finance Officer, reported on the budget expenditure and the balances as at year end 31st March 2019. The Council are moving forward in a good and prudent position for 2019-2020. See attached appendix 2(a-c).
- 5. Airport Update:** Cllr Duthie verbally reported that he had attended meeting 27th April. Two things stood out:
 - I. Mike Sparrow is encouraging the training people to increase their hours which will result in more flying in evenings and weekends.
 - II. Following sight of the Quarry's development plan, which included a large lake, Mike Sparrow had objected to it as it is on the flight path and in bird line. Resident Marion Fox advised this is unlikely to go ahead

 - I. Susan Hine, from the Village Hall Trustees read aloud the attached (appendix 3) report saying the Village Hall has had a successful year.
 - II. Cllr Macdonald read aloud the Weaveley Furze AGM report, updating on the annual activities (appendix 4).
- 7. Neighbourhood Plan:** Cllr Wylie and Cllr Kuziara briefed the Members of the Public on the purpose and Statutory Plan of the Parishes NP and how it related to CDC's 30-year Strategy Plan. The MOP were then invited to write up subject matters they felt should be addressed as part of the NP under the four topics: Environment & Development, Community & Wellbeing, Economy & Business and Transport & Tourism.
